Training teachers on Inclusive education approach

The main aim of the first MEDUS intellectual output is to develop an e-training course for teachers and special education staff "Inclusive education approach for successful integration of migrant pupils". This output is a very important part of the project as it combines all IOs into a common training programme, which is piloted with teachers and special education staff, including pupils from migrant backgrounds. The necessity to develop the training course is determined by the lack of training programmes, knowledge and skills that teachers and special education staff encounter when dealing with pupils from migrant background in class-room and afterschool activities. O1 is tailored to meet the needs of the two target groups: teachers and special education staff. The IO1 corresponds to the first objective of the project - provide

teachers and special education staff with innovative training material (OER) and tools to enable them to work with the diverse groups of pupils.

Module II "The Vertical classroom model - an innovative approach to deal with diversity in the classroom" Module III "Universal design in the classroom - an equal opportunity to succeed"


Module IV "Cooperation and mutual assistance of teachers and special education staff to support integration and learning of migrant pupils"

During the meeting in Bucharest, the partners responsible for each module and for the whole output presented the development stage of the curriculum at this moment. It is expected to have all the modules finalised until April.

12 pedagogical experiences in teaching to migrant

The main part of the fourth intellelectual outpus is already in the phase of final tunning and translation inthe mohter tounges.

These stories reveal successful integration of the migrant pupils (newly arrived and returning) and their parents into the school community. They are meant to showcase how the school staff of the host country meets the migrant pupils' individual, learning and adaptation needs in the new environment. How migrant pupils (including those with low motivation, with adverse minds, living in remote geographical areas, pupils with fewer learning possibilities, having the state of the state o special learning needs) adapt to new rules and routines in schools as well as deal with unfamiliar experiences in a new community.
